- The pawn moves one square forward, except for its first move, when it can move two squares forward. Pawns capture diagonally forward one square.

Basic Chess Strategies

- Control the center of the board. The center of the board is the most important area on the board, so try to control it with your pieces.

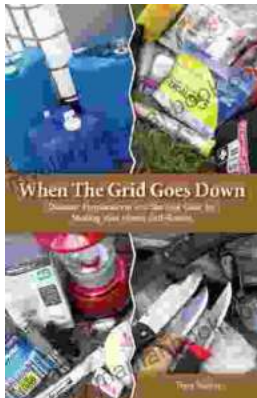


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
